What is Three For Me?

Three For Me is a promise: a promise from an adult to the school and a promise from adult to a child. By signing a promise card, adults commit to volunteer three hours of their time to the school. Whether you make copies for a teacher, have lunch with your child at school, read to children, file in the school office, help at a PTA or any non-profit group event, or bake cookies, every act of service is important. In addition, there are many opportunities for volunteerism, even in the home. If you work and have limited availability, the PTA will take the role to find activities you can do from home to fulfill your promise. *For volunteer opportunities at school, you can contact the PTA Volunteer Coordinator at VC@KincaidPTA.org, your student's Teacher, or Room Parent.*

Why is Three For Me Important?

A family's involvement in their child's education at both school and home is vital. By asking adults to sign a promise card, schools give those adults a reason to be there. Also, when adults come to school, it is important that they feel their time is well spent. Three for Me involves families in positive school experiences. Actions always speak louder than words, and children are the great imitators. Children see their family members participating in Three for Me and learn that their families care about school and that they, the children, should, in turn, care about school. Children also learn how to make and keep commitments. Furthermore, children who excel in school have families who show interest in school.

Thirty years of research clearly show that family involvement in schools improves student achievement. To reach their potential, students need families to take an active role in their education.
